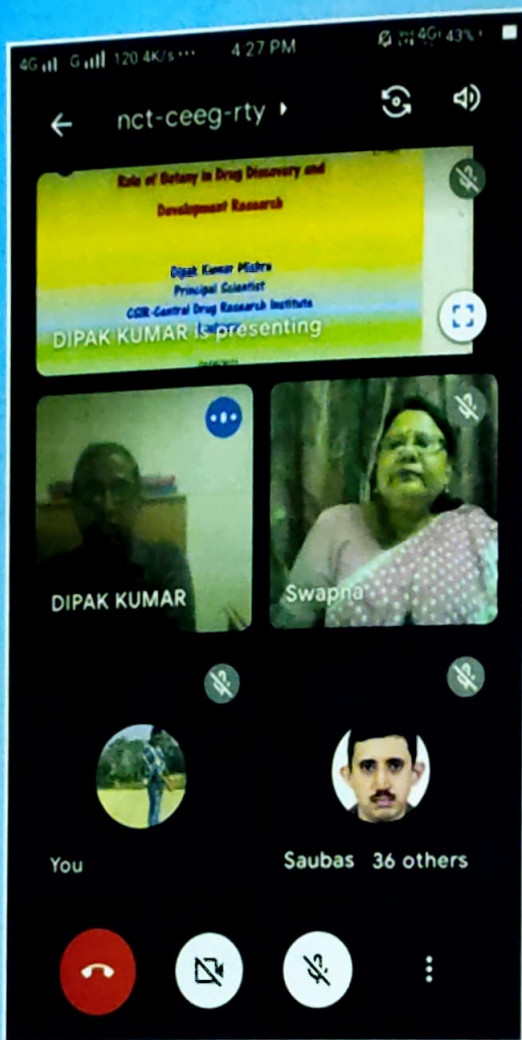

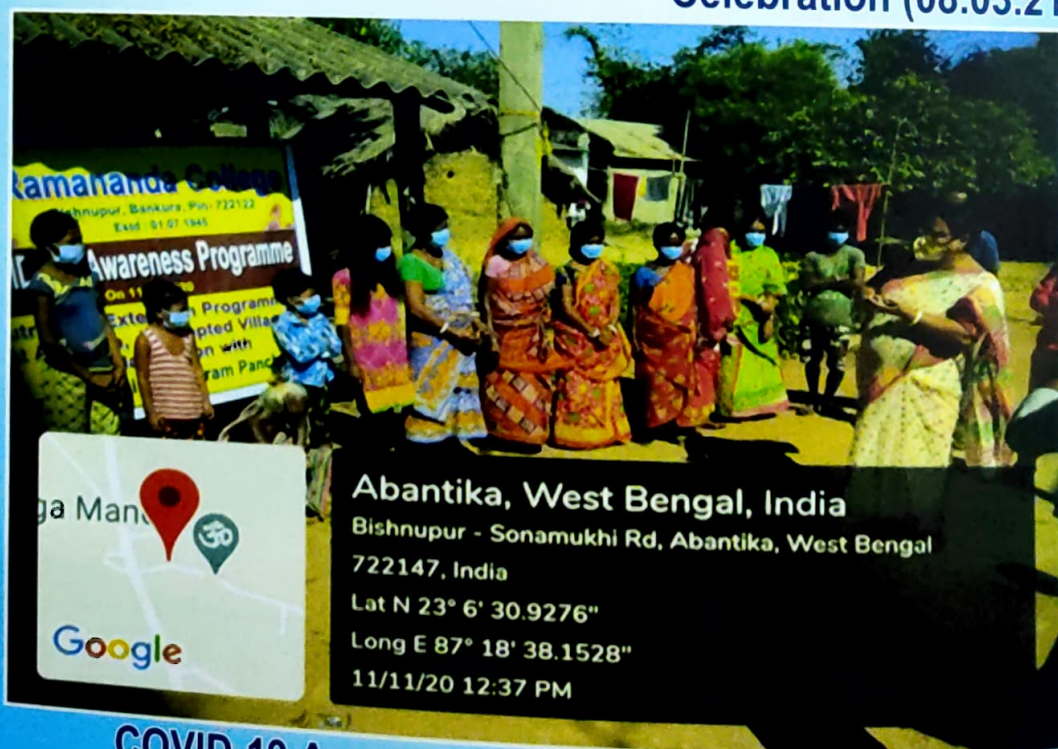

We observe this day to rejuvenate our thoughts related to the crucial field of education. On this auspicious day, we also resolve to promote education among our learners and among society at large as we believe that education is the best means of ensuring social justice, national integrity and communal harmony.

The institution has just completed 76 years of its responsibility as a sentinel of higher education in the Bishnupur sub-division of Bankura district. This great institution is carrying forward 76 years of a tradition of excellence by embracing the past, celebrating the present and building the future. Due to the onset of the COVID-19 pandemic across the world, we couldn't arrange a proper Platinum Jubilee celebration as we had plan. We have also been forced to postpone the closing ceremony which will be held later.

This year has witnessed drastic changes in educational system due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Education reform in India in the COVID-19 era is a living example of how need truly is the mother of invention (or reinvention, in this scenario). By allowing educational institutions to adopt online learning processes and induce a virtual study culture, our response to the pandemic is already steering the sector forward with technological innovation and advancements. The switch to online education has ensured that students do not suffer in terms of studies and that their progress is tracked simultaneously with timely evaluation. It is probably the first time that India is experimenting with the education system to make a paradigm shift to the virtual world, blending classroom teaching with online learning.

By marching along with the rest of the country, our institution is not lagging behind in integrating the new system of online education. Our faculty members have utilized various online platforms to communicate with the students as fully as possible and have completed syllabi in time. The IQAC of this institution has created an online library of e-content and model questions for students and faculties.

Short History of Ramananda College:

Ramananda College is a pioneering higher-educational institution located at Bishnupur, within the district of Bankura. It is the sole co-educational Degree College with PG courses recognized by the UGC within the town of Bishnupur. Since its inception in 1945, this institution has been serving the cause of higher education in the local community and also of students from far-away, remote villages. Even today students from other districts are studying here.

Sri Ramnalini Chakraborty, eminent freedom-fighter and social worker of Bishnupur, Sri Radhagobinda Roy, founder-principal of this college and ex-minister, Govt. of West Bengal and other eminent community members of Bishnupur decided to establish this college here. Sri Ramnalini Chakraborty, the Koley family, Sri Anil Kumar Bhattacharya, members of the Friends' Union Club and the community mainly funded the building of this college. The college is named after a son of the soil, Sri Ramananda Chattopadhyay (1865-1943), the journalist, editor and scholar who was active during the Bengal Renaissance.

Initially, the college was affiliated to the University of Calcutta, later to the University of Burdwan and is now affiliated to Bankura University since 1st January, 2017. The college is recognized by the UGC under Sections 2(F) and 12(B) of the UGC Act, 1956.. As the college was established before Independence, it pre-dates both the creations of the UGC and the University of Burdwan. In 2015, the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) re-accredited the College (in the 2nd cycle) with a score of 2.75 (Grade B). We have already completed our Self Study Report for the 3rd cycle of assessment, which has been approved by NAAC. We have already paid the requisite fees and are waiting for the NAAC to visit our college. If the environment is favourable, the NAAC PEER TEAM visit may take place in September or October 2021. Furthermore, with the introduction of different Post Graduate Courses in Sciences and Humanities, the college has become a constituent PG college of the Bankura University. Now the college is compliant with the visions of RUSA.

3. Academic Standards and Results

Duly qualified teachers, appointed through the College Service Commission (CSC), West Bengal and State Aided College teachers, in association with the non-teaching staff are engaged in serving the college to meet the needs of the students. Each year some students obtain University ranks and some of them achieve outstanding result. A good number of them secure an "Excellent" grade in the University Final Examinations. 25. NSS activities during 2020-21:

Ramananda College has two NSS units with 200 volunteers. They are enrolled every year in the month of July and are equally distributed to both Units I & II. They complete their course after two years' involvement. All the volunteers of Units-I&II regularly partake of activities together every Sunday to keep college campus clean. The college has organized a class twice a week to motivate them and improve their knowledge and general awareness. In this year, 24 volunteers were sent to several examination centers for smoothly conducting the 'National Means-cum-Merit Scholarship Examination and National Talent Search Examination' on 24.01.2021.

27. Netaji Subhas Open University-Ramananda College Study Centre (Code No. J-09) during 2020-21:

Ramananda College has a NSOU study centre. Dr. Deepak Kumar Singh is the coordinator of this study centre. During the academic year 2020-21, 139 students are admitted in different P.G. courses, while 12 students are admitted to the B.L.I.S. course, 03 student is admitted to the M.L.I.S. course and 482 students are admitted to the B.D.P. course..

28. Activities of the Indira Gandhi Open University-Ramananda College IGNOU Special Study Centre (CODE No. 2825-D) during 2020-21:

There is an IGNOU special study centre within the campus of Ramananda College. Prof. Ajit Debnath is the Coordinator of the study centre. The centre offers 14 professional and job-oriented courses. The study centre has 17 approved Academic Counsellors. The Academic Counsellors are actively engaged in the process of evaluation of assignments and counselling sessions of the learners. The number of newly registered and re-registered learners is 70 during the academic session of 2020-21. The centre has two part-time academic supporting staff involved in the official work of the centre. Regular counselling sessions are held as per IGNOU norms. During the period of COVID-19 pandemic the centre has been conducting online counselling sessions. 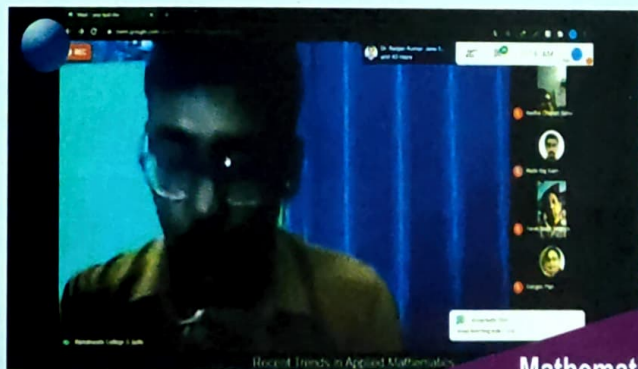

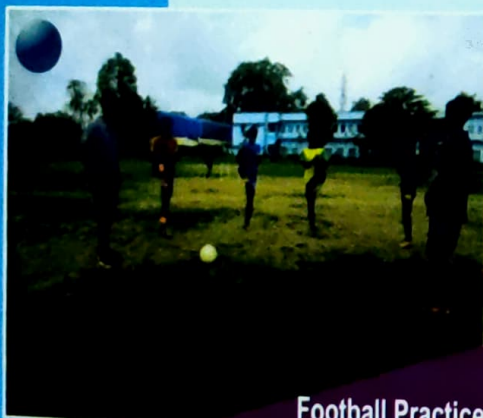
